2022-2023 School Registration

Thank you to those who have enrolled their child at OLLRCS for next school year. We currently have 48 returning students. We are predicting that some sections will have waiting lists once open enrollment hits on April 25th. We encourage you to register your child through our FACTS family portal and pay the nonrefundable \$100 registration fee plus the \$10 FACTS fee as soon as you are eligible to do so, if you intend on returning. As you can see below, we are giving our existing families first priority to re-enroll for the next school year.
